# Reading

Reading is fundamental for all learning. All children will have two coloured book banded reading books. When you listen to your child read, ask them questions about the text that they have read to develop their comprehension. Books can be changed any day of the week. When you child has finished their books, they need to put them in the box in the classroom. A member of staff will check their diary and talk to your child about their books. We will also have daily reading sessions in the classroom.

I hope that you have had a wonderful summer and are ready for the start of a New Year in Year 2. The children had a marvellous year in Year I and this is an excellent opportunity for us to build on the great things they did last year. I am really looking forward to the year ahead and to working with all of the children.

## Learning Update

Our topic for the term is 'Blast Off!' Within this topic, we will learn about the Space Race, Neil Armstrong and compare him to another explorer —Christopher Columbus. We will also design and make our own space buggies, looking at the best materials to use. There will be many opportunities to practise our art skills too. We will also look at the life of the artist Thomas Thorpe and create our own pictures based on his work. The space theme will also overlap into our English work. We will use the books 'The Way Back Home', 'The Man on the Moon' and 'Beegu' to help immerse ourselves in our learning. We will explore each text and then create our own writing including a character description, a letter, a diary and a narrative. The children will continue to develop their skills for writing and be introduced to a range of different sentence types. The children will
